MESSAGE

FROM THE PRESIDENT AND CEO



As we emerge from one of the most unusual periods in our history, we have learned how much we can achieve together, and how our efforts can benefit our communities and our forests. SFI has long been committed to sustainability, collaboration, and the robust values and benefits that come from forests.

Over the last year and a half, SFI and our network have innovated and adapted to keep focused on our mission to advance sustainability. We developed new forest sustainability and supply chain standards, launched on Earth Day, that go into effect in January 2022. These standards are focused on addressing critical global challenges and include the new SFI Climate Smart Forestry Objective and SFI Fire Resilience and Awareness Objective. We have also deepened the connections in our standards that will ensure respect for Indigenous Peoples' rights and traditional knowledge, and promote meaningful forest-focused relationship building.

Building on our belief that the next generation of forest and conservation leaders is critical to achieving our sustainability goals, Project Learning Tree and PLT Canada have developed new tools and resources to support career pathway development. PLT Canada has now placed over 3,700 young adults in Green Jobs with almost 1,700 of those during the pandemic. We have achieved gender balance in our placements, supported over 580 youth from Indigenous communities, and connected mentees and mentors through the Green Mentor program.

PLT refreshed the *Explore Your Environment: K-8 Activity Guide*, which includes hands-on activities that integrate investigations of nature with science, math, English language arts, and social studies and includes positive career connections throughout. PLT also launched its new *Forest Literacy Framework*, which translates the language of forests and sustainable forest management into concepts for everyone at any age.

SFI's Board approved a new Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion policy to help guide our commitment to creating space for all communities to fully and meaningfully participate in the journey towards a sustainable future.

This last year showed us that working together to solve our future challenges is more important now than ever. Thanks to so many of you for your collaboration and leadership, and I look forward to many bright days ahead.

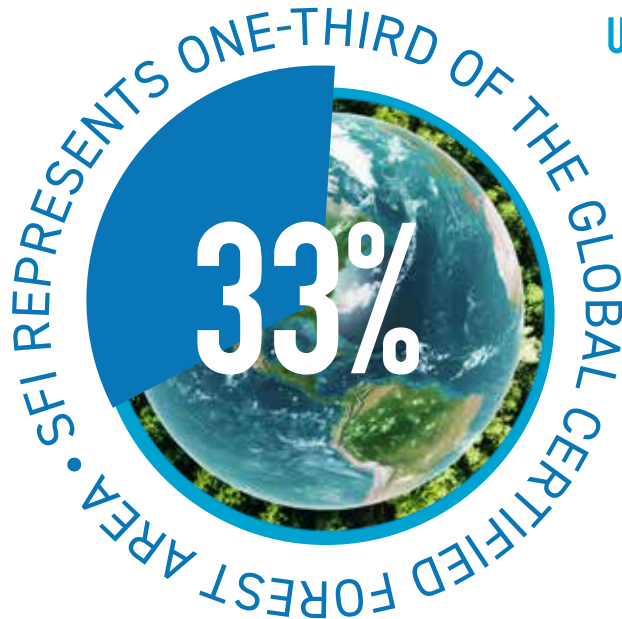

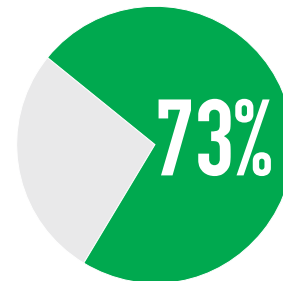

SFI SUPPORTS THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN FORESTS AND INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES

The new SFI standards include updates to Objective 8, Recognize and Respect Indigenous Peoples' Rights, which promote respect for Indigenous Peoples' rights, representative institutions, and traditional knowledge, and are aligned with the principles of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. SFI has also developed the SFI Small-Scale Module for Indigenous Peoples and Families, invested over \$300,000 into Indigenous-led community and conservation projects, and supported over 580 paid Green Jobs experiences for Indigenous youth.

SFI IS DEVELOPING A NEW SFI URBAN AND COMMUNITY FOREST SUSTAINABILITY STANDARD

This new SFI standard is being developed in partnership with American Forests, Arbor Day Foundation, the ISA, the SMA, and Tree Canada. Urban and community forestry involves both planning and management of the urban forest because the right tree, planted in the right place, in the right way, promotes the many benefits trees provide for people, wildlife, and climate. Benefits for communities include improved health and well-being, social cohesion and accessibility, climate change solutions, reduced air pollution, outdoor learning environments, and improved urban design.

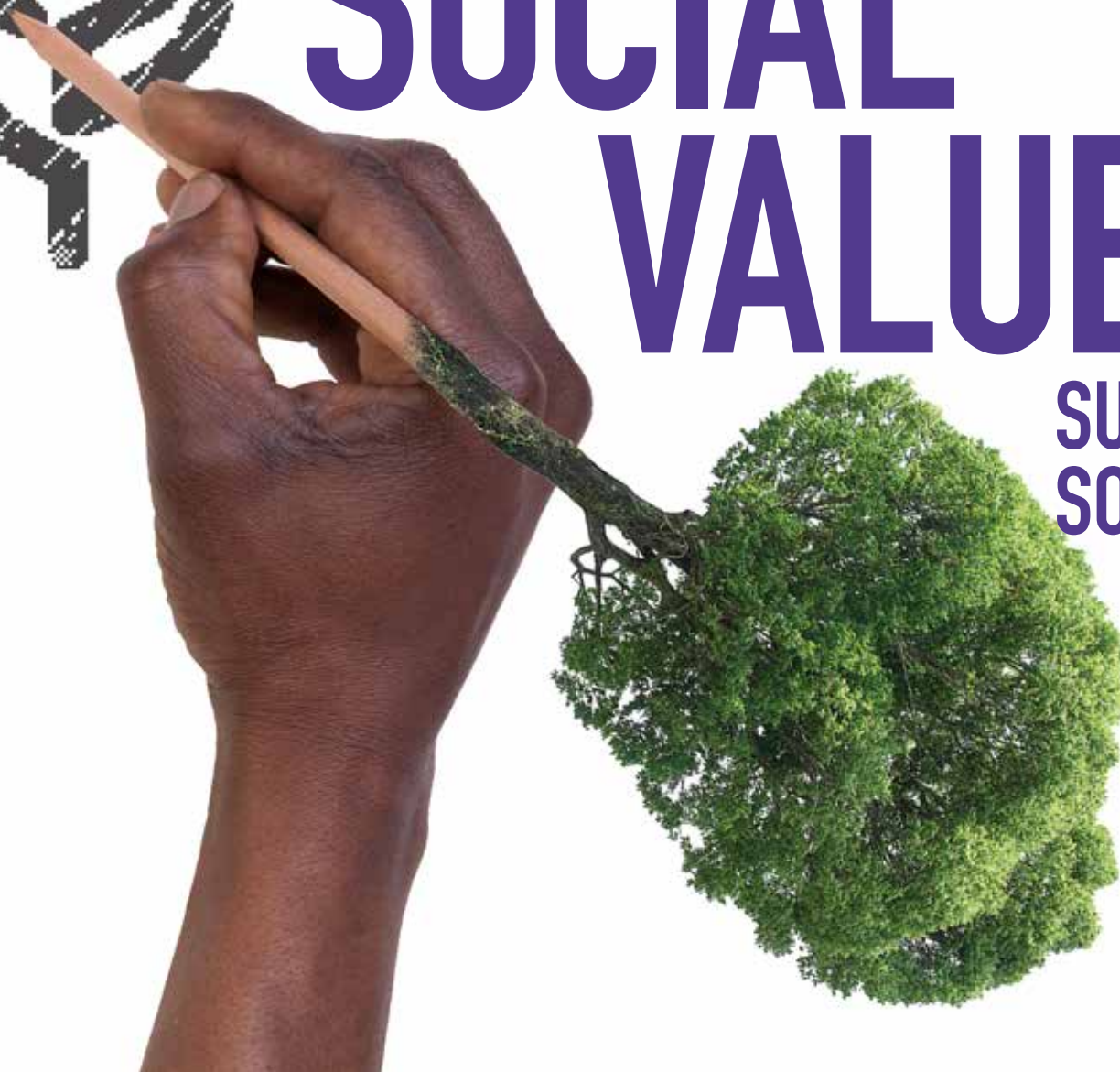

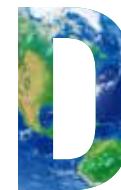

SFI FUNDING

SFI is primarily supported financially by fees from SFI-certified organizations who use the program's forest management and fiber sourcing standards. These SFI-certified organizations include private landowners, forest product companies, managers of public lands, Indigenous communities and their businesses, conservation organizations, state and local public agencies, community interests, and universities.

In 2020, SFI-certified organizations provided 82% of the funding for SFI and the remaining 18% came from annual conference revenue, service agreements, investment income and other sources.

SFI funding is not tied to the certification decision.

SFI-certified organizations are audited by independent certification bodies accredited by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), ANAB and/or the Standards Council of Canada (SCC). SFI has no role in determining whether a certificate is granted—this decision is made independently by the certification bodies.

SFI ERP



The SFI External Review Panel is a distinguished group of independent experts representing U.S. and Canadian conservation, professional, academic, and public organizations. The panel provides external input and operates independently from SFI.

The panel oversees the SFI standards review process and conducts an annual independent review of the SFI standards to ensure the annual SFI progress report objectively and credibly states the status of SFI implementation.

The External Review Panel has reviewed the data used in this report, and believes it to be objective, meaningful, and credible.

The two-year SFI standards revision process that concluded in 2021 was comprehensive, transparent, and led to some significant changes in standards requirements. Most notably to us are new requirements for Objectives on Climate Smart Forestry, Fire Resilience and Awareness, and the recognition of and respect for Indigenous Peoples' Rights. These are critical issues that must be addressed to meet sustainability goals.


A commitment to continuous improvement has been the keystone for SFI since its inception and this latest standard revision process was true to that commitment. The External Review Panel reviewed how the Standards Revision Task Groups addressed all the comments received during the two public comment periods. We found the consideration of these comments to be transparent and balanced and we appreciate the speed in which SFI staff responded to our questions. It is notable that almost 2,300 individuals and organizations participated in the review process and submitted comments on the drafts of the SFI 2022 Standards.

SFI is to be commended for their efforts to get stakeholders engaged in the review process. There are many challenges that lie ahead for our forests and the many benefits they provide society. We encourage SFI to remain vigilant about opportunities to understand the impacts of the new SFI standard requirements, and ways to support the SFI Implementation Committees. SFI also has an opportunity to better align its programs with environmental, social, and governance (ESG) criteria. This is an area of growing importance as it relates to employees, customers, and the communities where SFI operates. We challenge SFI to become a leader in the forestry community in embracing and supporting ESG through its standards, grant programs, and in working with its members.
